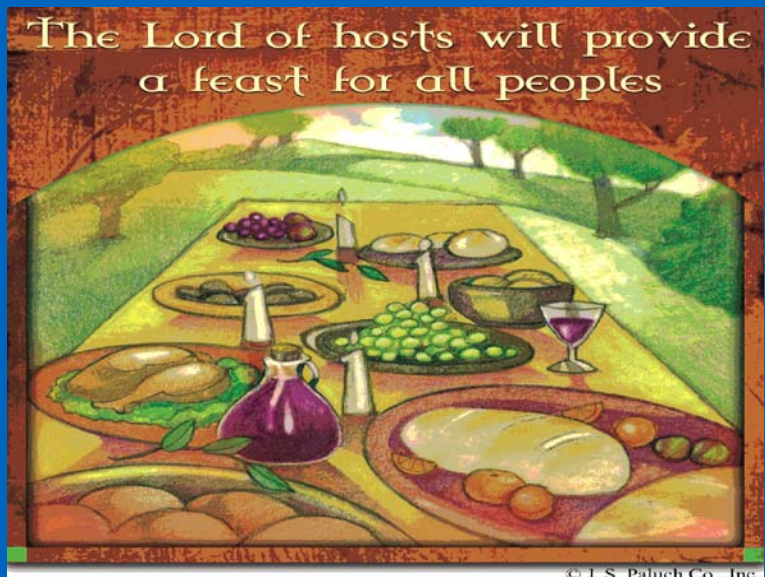

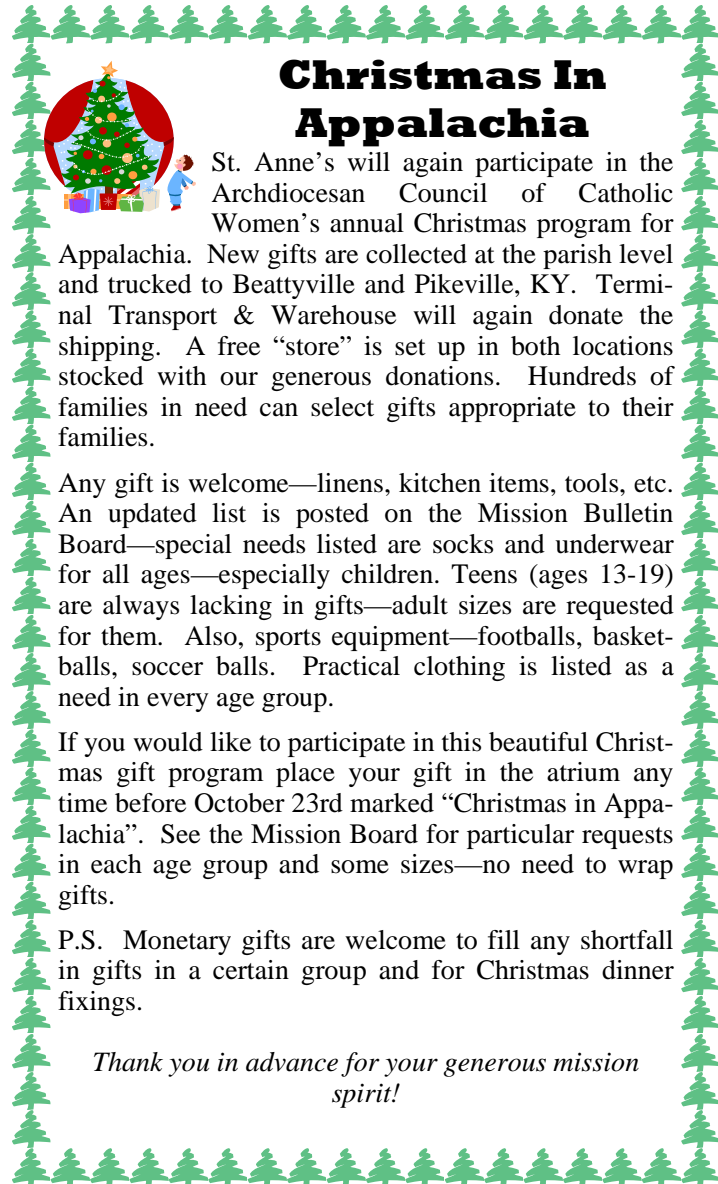


World Mission Sunday is Coming on October 23rd!

Any gift is welcome—linens, kitchen items, tools, etc. An updated list is posted on the Mission Bulletin Board—special needs listed are socks and underwear for all ages—especially children. Teens (ages 13-19) are always lacking in gifts—adult sizes are requested for them. Also, sports equipment—footballs, basketballs, soccer balls. Practical clothing is listed as a need in every age group.

Life is Primary

A major Vatican document reminds us that the right to life is primary: "The teachings of Pope John XXIII, the Second Vatican Council, and Pope Paul VI have given abundant indication of the concept of human rights as articulated by the Magisterium. Pope John Paul II has drawn up a list of them in the Encyclical Centesimus Annus... The first right presented in this list is the right to life, from conception to its natural end, which is the condition for the exercise of all other rights and, in particular, implies the illicitness of every form of procured abortion and euthanasia" (Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church, Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, Vatican City, 2004).
